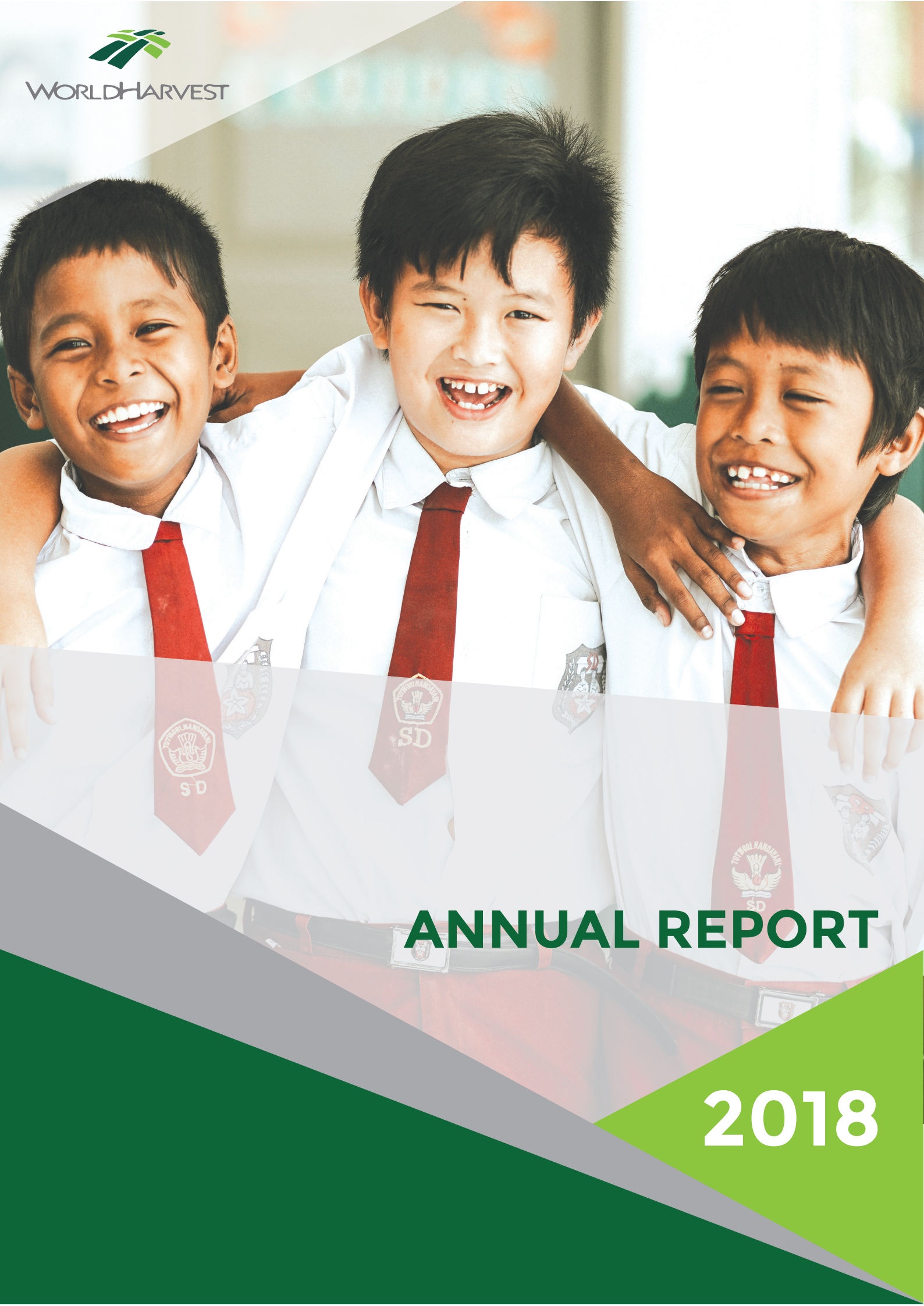

At World Harvest we believe that learning is a fundamental human right; but in most countries it is considered a privilege. So, we were on a mission to help those with a dream of an education. For just \$30 a sponsor would receive a backpack for themselves and send another backpack full of school supplies to a child in need. With the help of amazing sponsors and donors we were able to distribute 300 backpacks full of school supplies to Fairgrove Academy in La Puente, California.



MONROVIA DAY

World Harvest was a proud participant of the three-day birthday celebration for the town of Monrovia! Nearly 10,000 people joined the festivities like like entertainment, game booths, and carnival rides. We hosted a game booth called the Roller Boller and had hundreds of people visit our booth where we were displaying who we are and our Back to School Campaign. Through this event we were able to engage more with our community and bring in more people to join us in our mission to impact people around the world.





SUMMER MISSION

Our Summer Mission team headed to Bali, Indonesia to provide medical care and teach about the effects of drug abuse and the benefits of abstinence. We were able to educate 2,000 students and open 7 medical camps, that were able to provide care for over 800 patients.



WORLD HARVEST EUROPE

CARE FOR LUMAJANG, EAST JAVA

On July 7, 2018, World Harvest Europe (WHE) visited Sumber Mujur Village, Lumajang Regency, East Java with the purpose of giving aid for orphans and widows in its surrounding communities. We provided school bags, notebooks and school equipment for orphans, and 250 packages of basic necessities (rice, cooking oil, and instant noodles) to widows.

During this visit, Mrs. Linda, the Director of WHE, shared her life story to empower the people. Mrs. Linda was also born into a poor family who lived in this village that experienced scarcity. However, although she was poor, Linda shared how she had a strong will and a persevering attitude which motivating her to keep learning and working hard through her struggle. It was this zest for life that allowed Linda to now live comfortably in Amsterdam, Holland and work as the Director of World Harvest Europe.

This event was supported by the local government. Mr. Bambang, a member of the Lumajang Regency 's City House Representative, Mr. Saffie, the head of Sumber Mujur Village and the Lumajang District Police Chief were present.

SCHOOL VISIT, Wahana Harapan School Kp. Melayu

Instead, Mrs. Linda encouraged the students to study hard and push to reach their dreams. No dream is ever too small or too large when you commit to making small steps to get there. This visit ended with having lunch together with the students and by distributing gifts to them.



FREE MEDICAL TREATMENT , KP. BAYAM, NORTH JAKARTA

Kampung Bayam is located under the highway and next to the railroad tracks in North Jakarta. Most of the people that live in this community live below the poverty line. On July 31, 2018, Mrs. Linda and the World Harvest Europe team visited this community and gave free medical treatment to 134 residents.

WORLD HARVEST CARES FOR LOMBOK

In mid-2018, the island of Lombok was hit by successive earthquakes that took place on:

- The first earthquake hit on July 29, 2018 with a magnitude of 6.4 Mw
- The second earthquake followed on August 5 2018 with a magnitude of 7.0 Mw
- The third and final earthquake took place on August 19 with a magnitude of 6.5 Mw

Altogether, these earthquakes damaged over 23,000 of houses, killed 400 hundred people and an estimated 800 people were injured. Over 134,000 people were forced to live in refugee camps. These earthquakes caused both immense physical and psychological trauma for the citizens of Lombok.

As a response to this tragedy, our team was moved to provide emergency aid for the victims of these earthquakes. We successfully distributed:

- 1,242 packages of daily necessities consisting of medicine, cooking oil, and snacks
- 600 boxes of Mineral Water
- 530 kg of rice
- 400 packages of babies' supplies
- 10 Tents
- 7 toilets facilities
- 1500 Stationery packages

We distributed these materials to 151 shelters that consisted of approximately 15,000 families. We also provided assistance to help the children overcome their traumatic experiences by playing games, doing drawing, story telling and dancing lessons. With the help of these activities, we hope that we were able to begin easing the children's trauma, reassuring them that they have a hope-filled future.

WORLD HARVEST CARES FOR PALU

On September 28, 2018, an earthquake with a magnitude of 7.4 MW hit Donggala and Palu in Sulawesi. It was followed by a tsunami. The epicenter was 26 km north of Donggala and 80 km northwest of Palu with a depth of 10 km. As a result of these disasters:

- 2,113 people died
- 4,612 people were injured
- 1,309 people were declared missing
- 223,751 people became refugees

In response to this disaster, World Harvest sent a team to help the victims in Sulawesi. Our team set up a shelter in Donggala, and distributed 18 tons of food, clean water and medical assistance for around 12,000 victims.

NEW HOME FOR KHAIRUNISSA

Khairunnisa is one of our sponsored children from the Jatinegara community located in East Jakarta. She has been under our care since she was in the third grade. Growing up, she lived with her parents and younger sister in a small house that barely stayed together. The floor was pure dirt and the foundations of the home were falling apart due to rain. Her father works as a garbage collector in the area, and his income averaged just about 70 dollars per month. Her family struggled financially, making a home renovation the least of their priorities.

Throughout the years, the rain hit her house brought significant damages to the point where it was not able to be lived in when it was flooded. The family had to move to different places to stay until the water receded.

In response to this family's need for proper housing, World Harvest took action and rebuilt the house in three weeks. Now, Khairunissa and her family can live comfortably without ever fearing rain.

Mrs. Yakolina Kambun has been a partner of World Harvest for 13 years. She helps out with the Wates community, which is located in a rural part of Jakarta. Many of the people living in this community live below the poverty line, thus there are many children who are unable to go to school. To address this issue, her and her late husband was moved to help children in the Wates Community to attain proper education. Thus, they built a school.

In the process of finishing up the proposal for the building of the school, her husband passed away. In light of this tragedy, however, Mrs. Yakolina pushed through to build this school as a way to honor her late husband.

Mrs. Yakolina worked hard in the next few months. She sent off a proposal to request for funding from a variety of foundations and churches. Her hard work finally paid off when World Harvest partnered with her in 1994, establishing the Hosana School. When it was first built, only had a kindergarten class. Over time, it developed to having a junior high school class that hold 267 students. All children who attends Hosana receive free education.

Today, Hosana School is a thriving school where children in the area look forward to study here. And World Harvest is there to help these students through our SAC program. We also give free nutritional food to the students daily. She is very grateful to World Harvest, because through this partnership, she is able to offer employment opportunities for several parents of students.

WAHANA HARAPAN SCHOOL

Educating and preparing 388 future leaders in 6 WAHANA HARAPAN schools.

Education is an integral part of growth and freedom. It is one of the key definers of change and the ability to empower people to create the lives that they dream of. Through Wahana Harapan, one of World Harvest's main goals is to provide quality education for disadvantaged communities. The six schools we have built over the past few years include:

- School of Wahana Harapan Kedaung (Kindergarten through Elementary)
- School Wahana Harapan Kampung Melayu (Kindergarten through Elementary)
- School of Wahana Harapan Tegal Angus (Kindergarten through Elementary and Junior High)
- Wahana Harapan Cibinong School (Kindergarten)
- School of Wahana Harapan Kampung Sawah (Kindergarten)
- School of Wahana Harapan Nias (Kindergarten)

These schools have raised outstanding students. In 2018 alone, 20 of our students who won awards at the inter-school Olympics, a competition that involves 45 schools from all around Tangerang.



VELLICIA ARTETA – FIRST PLACE MATHEMATIC OLYMPIAD DISTRICT LEVEL

Due to her willingness to learn, maintain high enthusiasm and diligence, Vellicia took home first place in the Mathematics Olympiad. This competition was had 16 participants from 20 schools around the districts of Sepatan Timur, Tangerang.

In spite of her family's economic difficulties, she never allowed any circumstance to get in her way in achieving what she wanted. She is a shining example that anyone can succeed if they work hard. She wants to strive to win more awards and curate the future she desires.

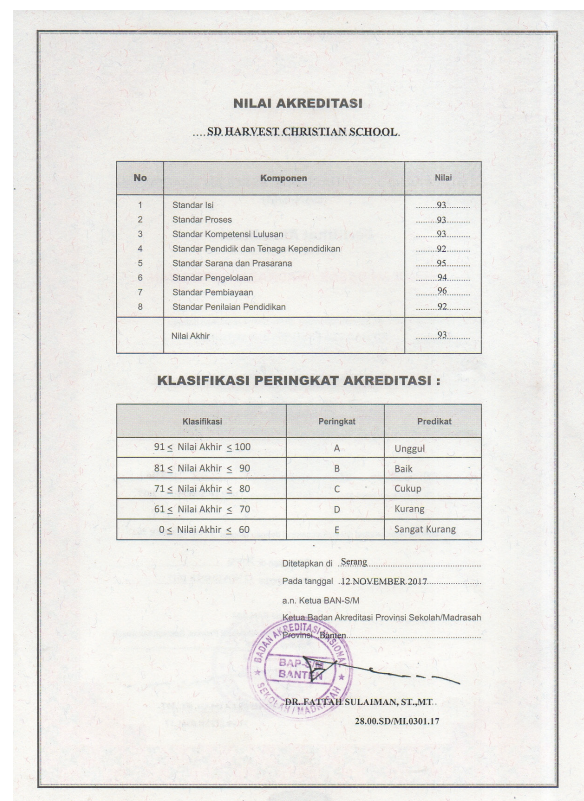
10 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

2018 was a big year for Harvest Christian School (HCS). It marked the institution's 10th year anniversary. Over the past few years, as many as 508 children have graduated from our programs. Within 10 years, 1,925 students have enrolled here.

To celebrate the 10th anniversary of HCS, on October 2018, HCS held a festival of celebration. It was attended by 845 people included students, parents and teachers. We had many fun and creative performances in celebrating the 10 years we had walked together. We are hopeful for the future, and are excited to keep pioneering in the academic space.



Aside from celebrating the 10th year anniversary, HCS also received an A grade accreditation from the National Accreditation Board, depicting the quality of the education of the institution we have built. In the next few years, HCS will continue to commit to being a national plus school that prioritizes good Christian values, press on the importance of integrity and truth that we may produce future leaders who have a positive impact on the nation.



HARVEST INTERNATIONAL THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

25 YEARS ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



Over the past 25 years, 2, 023 students have graduated from our leading theological institution, Harvest International Theological Seminary (HITS) . The leaders that have graduated through our institution are well-spread throughout the world, pioneering their respective locations. Our alumni play important roles in their respective fields and occupy various roles. Amongst the many, our students have become as deans, lecturers, officials in church synods, entrepreneurs, leaders in political parties, lawyers and so on.

As an insitution, HITS offers a Bachelor of Arts in Theology, PAK (Christian Religious Education) Study Program, an Ecclesiastical Music Study Program, and a Christian Leadership Study Program. Additionally, in the Masters and Doctoral Programs, HITS offers a Christian Leadership program.

HITS is also actively involved in advancing the world of theological education,. For instance, Dr. Arnold Tindas, Director of the HITS Postgraduate Program is also the Theological Chair in the fellowship of the Evangelical Theological Seminaries in Indonesia (PASTI).

In 2018, as many as 449 students registered as students at HITS. Additionally, this year alone, 25 Undergraduate candidates, 14 Masters candidates and 4 Doctoral candidates graduated from HITS.

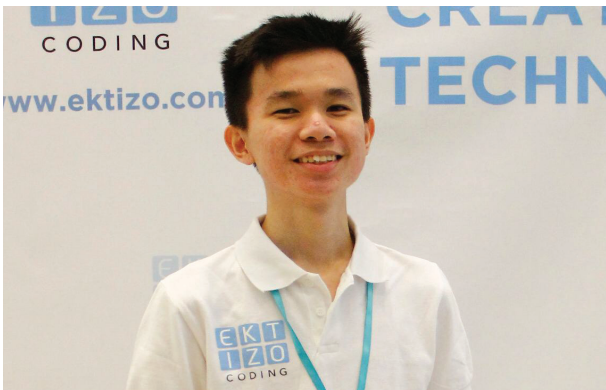

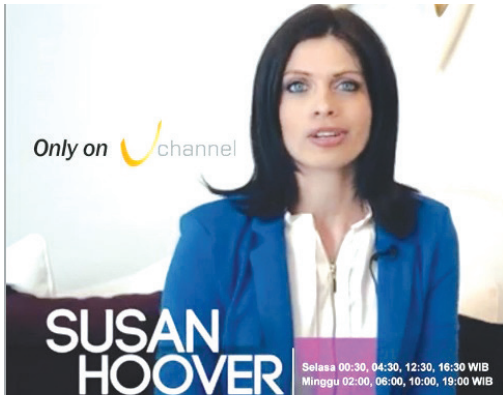
